This theme aims to discuss diverse views on evidence-informed supports, and services across the entire lifespan.




# PROGRESS IN EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS AND DISABILITY SUPPORTS



CALS2022 was delivered through a hybrid virtual and in-person model. Registrants could attend CALS2022 in-person at the following satellite sites, in: Calgary AB,

Burlington ON, Durham ON, Brampton ON, and Whitehorse YT.

The goal of this model was to create an innovative, collaborative and pivotal conference for Autistic people, their families, and those who support them.



For the first time, both days of the conference were translated, allowing attendees across Canada, whether their preferred language is French or English, to attend CALS2022.

With materials live translated in both English and French, we were able to make our event more accessible than ever before.





### What was the most valuable aspect of CALS2022?

Respondents predominantly indicated that the most valuable aspect of CALS2022 was the lived experience from Autistic presenters and diversity of speakers. Many specified the importance of the presentations "Shifting the Paradigm About Non-Speaking Autistics," "The Power of Movement," and the international panel "Towards a Canadian National Autism Strategy." Respondents shared how they valued the variety in the content and topics covered over the two days. They also indicated how the Summit being hosted virtually was beneficial for them.


### What was the least valuable aspect of CALS2022?

Many respondents noted that they did not find any aspect of CALS2022 to be the least beneficial. Some respondents indicated they felt there were not enough **break periods**, or the break periods were not long enough. Others reported that there was too much **repetition** regarding certain topics. Respondents also shared that there was too much content from service providers and/or research based organizations. The Summit being hosted virtually was presented in responses as the least valuable for various reasons, including a lack of opportunities for **Q&A and/or networking**, and navigation of the Whova platform.

### What do CALS participants want to see in the future?

Respondents voiced wanting to hear from the **researchers** in the field, and highlighted learning about **research-informed approaches** to services, education, policy, and the Autistic lifespan. Additionally identified was the request for content regarding **navigating institutions and services** and the justice system. In a similar manner, respondents also emphasized **education**, educator organizations, and **mental health** in relation to education as topics of interest. There was also a common theme of wanting continued and increased **Autistic representation** in these conversations.
